A Message From Pastor Christine

Hope in a Season from Darkness to Light

y the time we reach January, I have been immersed in the amazing and beautiful imagery of the Incarnation from scripture. The light of the world, Jesus Christ, has come! It's no wonder we have come to celebrate Christmas during the darkest time of the year. The season of darkness is often a difficult time for many in these winter days. I'm always amazed at how fast we lose our daylight during the winter months and then, bam! Suddenly, it seems like the light quickly returns, seconds every day, rushing back towards us. The sunset at 4:30pm is no longer!

I recently shared Emily Dickenson's Poem "Hope is the thing with feathers" in a homily. Emily Dickenson suffered from a disorder we know today as agoraphobia. She had a fear of leaving her home and restricted herself to being around family members. In her day, people called her eccentric for it, as her disorder was not understood. But I love her poetry because, although she dealt with some acute darkness in her life, her poetry is full of hope, life, and faith.

"Hope is the thing with feathers," wrote Dickenson. The problem with a lot of darkness in winter though, is that often you can't see the trees let alone the things that are perched there. But aren't we similar? We may not hope for things with feathers, but we still hope for better futures. Hope is like a Christmas list. We hope for the things we desire and want in life.


And, even in the darkness, we need to keep on hoping for something. Sometimes, we don't know what to hope for.

I see this over and over when a loved one is dying. Last year, I witnessed how more than one family had to make hard decisions that would affect the outcome of a loved one. They would say, "I don't even know what to hope for. Do I hope she goes quickly now, or do I hope she recovers? And, if she recovers, will she even have a life that is full? What do I hope for in this?"

In times such as those, and in times of my life where difficulty loomed like the short days we experience in winter, I could observe and feel within myself that some deep, abiding hope held them and held me. For as Christians, our hope in something is a hope in 'someone', Jesus Christ. We hope in someone as the people of God were reminded in Colossians, "Christ in you, the hope of glory."

It turns out that there is a season of light awaiting us, and the stable lamp is lighting our way. In hope, let us go from Bethlehem bringing that hope to others. The world awaits us. Peace, Pastor Christine ...

Sabbatical Announcement


