
that occurs to most of us.

Having worked with those who grieve, it's also fraught with unnecessary insurance challenges and costly end of life realities. Why not talk about this out loud with community members? This summer, I invite you to join me in reading the book by Atul Gawande called "Being Mortal: Medicine and What Matters in the End".
