## A Message From Pastor Christine

"You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather, serve one another humbly in love." – Galatians 5:13

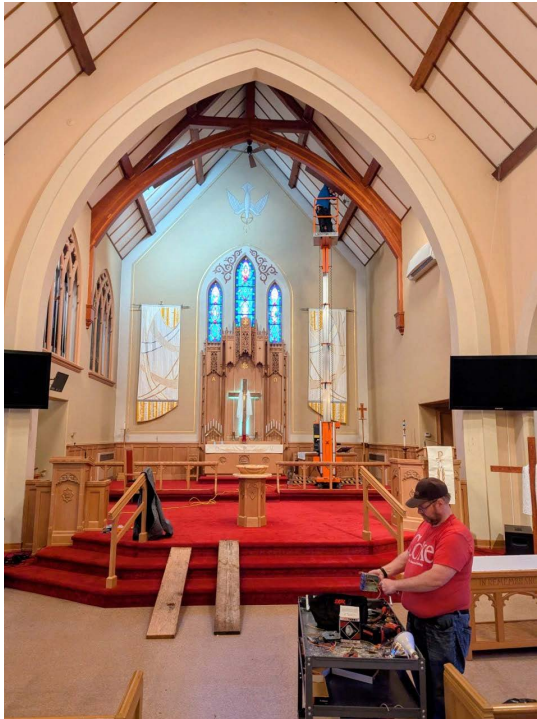
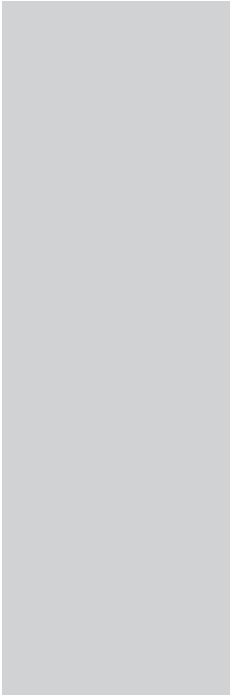
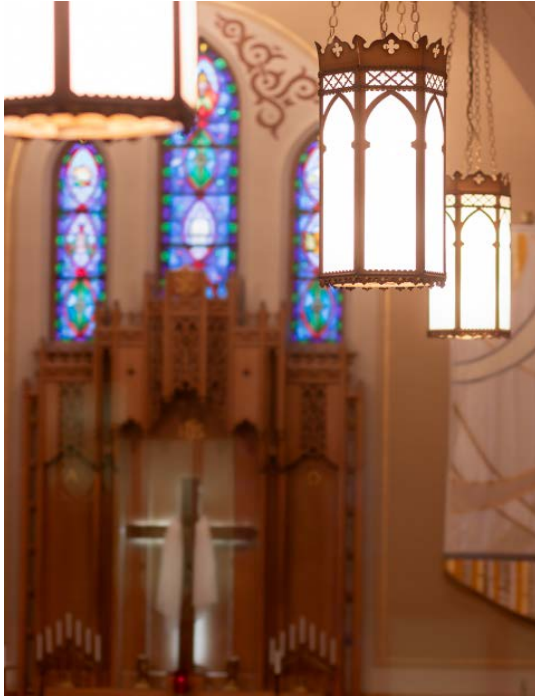


# Let there be light!

Stay tuned for more updates and upgrades in our building's 70th year!





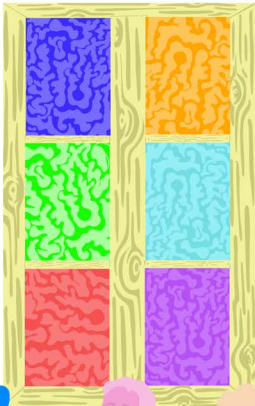

## The Carthage Commitment

In partnership with the ELCA congregations in southern Wisconsin and as part of our pledge to make a quality education possible for all, we offer the Carthage Commitment.

At Carthage College, we want families to know they're not alone in paying for a student's education. We view college financing as a partnership, with assistance from a variety of sources.

The Carthage Commitment is born out of that spirit. Open to Wisconsin families whose household income is **less than \$65,000**, it will cover tuition costs not covered by federal and state grant funds. Recipients will have **no out-of-pocket tuition costs** to attend Carthage.

This program is open to all new incoming students who begin in fall 2025 or later.

### Eligibility

- Be admitted to Carthage
- Submit the FAFSA
- Have a household income of less than \$65,000 (Be PELL Eligible as determined by the FAFSA)
- Be a Wisconsin resident
- Have a high school GPA of 2.5 or above
- Be a member of an ELCA congregation in Wisconsin

### What does the Carthage Commitment cover?

The Carthage Commitment covers the cost of tuition for fall and spring semesters and on-campus J-Term courses.

### What isn't included in the Carthage Commitment?

Books, room and board, J-Term study tours, and parking are not covered by the Carthage Commitment.

### Do I have to take out the Stafford Loan

No! Through generous donors, your Stafford Loan of \$5,500 would be covered. Your out-of-pocket cost to attend Carthage for tuition would be zero.

### How do I apply?

To be considered for the Carthage Commitment, students must **apply for admission** to Carthage.. They must also submit the FAFSA. Applications are accepted anytime after completion of junior year of high school. Not yet a senior or rising senior? **Join our mailing list.**

### When will I find out if I qualify?

Once we receive the FAFSA, we will notify students who are eligible for the Carthage Commitment. Eligible students will be awarded the grant if state and federal grants don't cover the full cost of tuition.

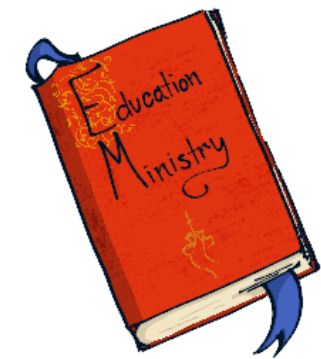

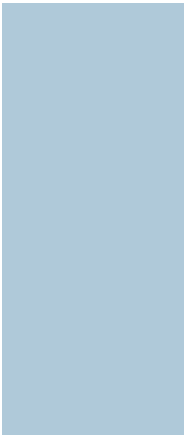

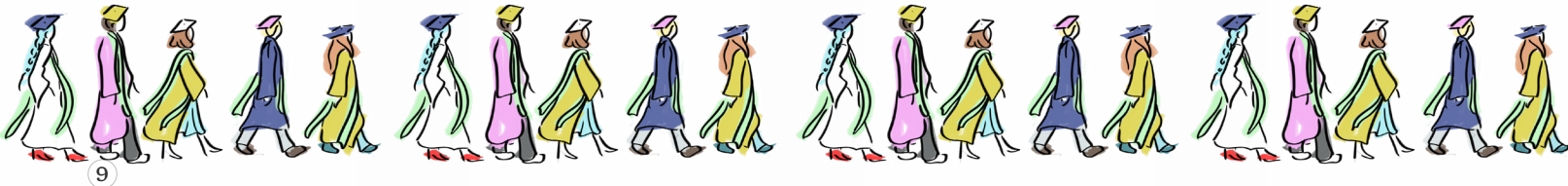
