Join Caretakers of Creation in prayer on September 1st to celebrate the International Day of Prayer for Creation! This is a wonderful kickoff to the Season of Creation. The Prayer for Creation will be in the Opportunities and will be sent out in an e-card.

Season of Creation is an annual celebration from Sept. 1 to Oct. 4 when Christians come together in prayer and action to protect God's creation. The theme for 2025 is "Peace with Creation". The ecumenical family around the world will unite to advocate for our common home, Earth. As co-founder and chair of the CV Biodiversity Partnership, she has led efforts to defend water quality, protect mature forests, and rewild our community, drawing knowledge and inspiration from Doug Tallamy and others.

Her interactive talk will prompt us to confront the often unappreciated services nature provides to us within our urban forests— and the subtle wonders we often fail to notice. Jane invites participants to consider our interconnection, responsibilities and collective impact. Together, we'll reflect on practical ways to support the natural world and take meaningful steps—no matter how small—toward restoring what's been diminished, while nurturing what still endures in the places we call home.

Cemetery Work Project

September 8 and 22 have been scheduled to begin cleanup of St. John's Cemetery located off Omaha Street.

We will be removing dead planting from alongside gravestones, trimming suckers from trees, trimming the cedars, raking dead grass between headstones, picking up sticks and pinecones and blowing the dead grass from around gravestones and roadway.

We will start at 9 am and meet in front of the shed located at the back of the lot. Bring water and a snack, work gloves and a hat. Tools include: rake, hedge trimmers, clippers/loppers, small saw for tree limbs, a knife to trim grass around the stones, flat-edge shovel, blower for dead grass and debris. 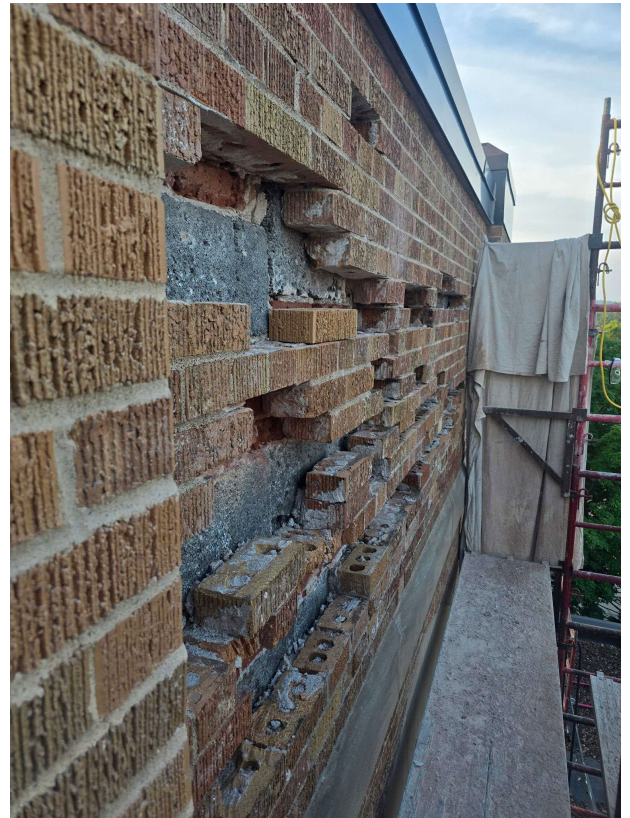

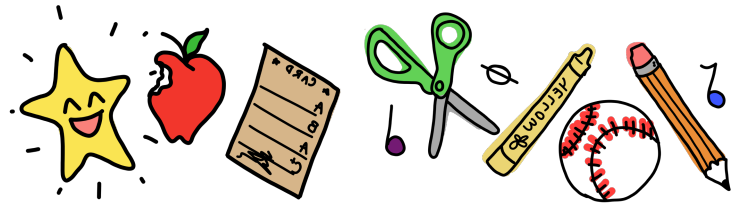
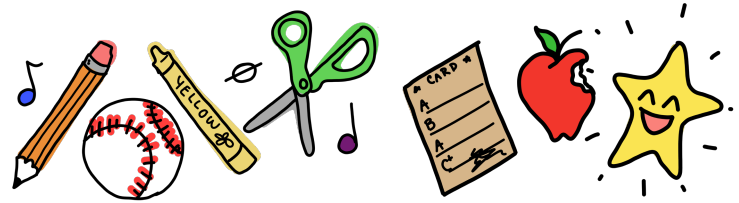
Welcome Back!

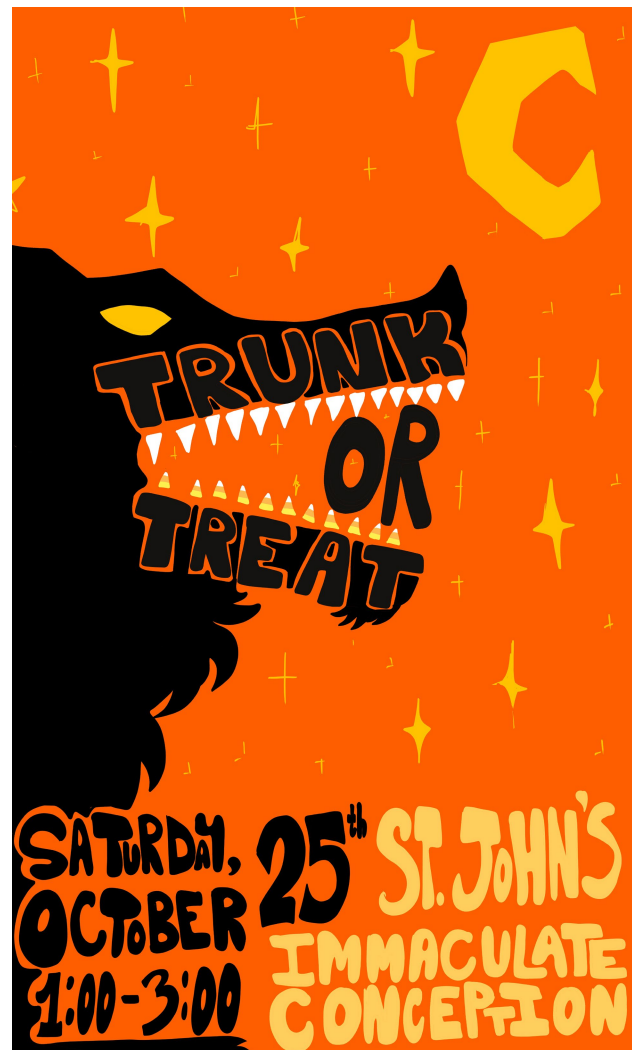
